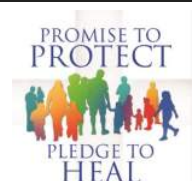

Dear Parish Family,

Catholicism is really quite cool. Just think of all the liturgical colors we use: green, red, gold, white, silver, black, purple, violet, and, for just two days a year, rose! This Advent weekend is Gaudete Sunday, when the penitential color of violet lightens to rose, and the third candle, also rose, is lit on the Advent Wreath.

The liturgical colors we know today, white, green, red, black, purple/violet, were codified in the 13th century by Pope Innocent III, who died in the year 1216. Rose was added late in the 13th century. Rose, properly speaking, is “rosacea,” a combination of red and white, meant to be on the pastel side of colors. It can vary from very pinkish to salmon, rose, etc.

For most of the first millennium of Christianity, the primary color was white, and even today priests, who concelebrate with their bishop, wear white vestments regardless of the color of the season in which the Mass is being said, with the Bishop wearing the proper liturgical color, and maybe a few key clergy surrounding him, in the same liturgical seasonal color.

The use of colors in the Mass has an interesting history. What I have written above applies only to the Latin or Western Church. The Eastern Rites have always spoken only of “bright” and “dark” colors. Indeed, the Eastern Rite Church’s liturgical cycle colors differ significantly from those in the Western Church.

Prior to the codification of liturgical colors, many local Churches used their own classifications: the Church of Jerusalem included blue in its repertoire; the English Church used Sarum Blue for Advent; and the Church of Milan used black for Lent. Additionally, for a time in the Middle Ages, some local Churches stipulated the use of “cerulean blue” for the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception.

Since the 12th century, liturgical colors have been standardized. Rose, or rosacea, has been used since the 13th century for the third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday) and the fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare Sunday). Rose is a beautiful and hopeful color that marks a joyful pause in the four-week cycle of Advent and reminds us that “the Lord is near” as we prepare the way of the Lord.

A gentle reminder: we are trying to eliminate the smallest of our mortgages, “Loan 4.” If we pay it off by December 31st, the payoff amount is \$35,912.22. If you can make a “Christmas Gift,” an end-of-the-year donation, or an RMD donation toward the loan, it would be great to pay this off.
