Dear Parish Family,

As we continue to celebrate the Easter Season, we also welcome May, a month when we honor Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and our own mothers. You may notice the Altar Cloth features the AM symbol, with a crown above it and a moon below. The AM stands for Ave Maria in Latin, which are the words the Angel spoke to Mary at the Annunciation.



Last weekend, we held May Crownings after three Masses. After the 5pm and 10:30am Masses, we gathered at the Statue of Our Lady of Fatima. After the homily at the 1:30pm First Holy Communion Mass, the children crowned the Icon of Our Lady of Tenderness and each placed a flower.

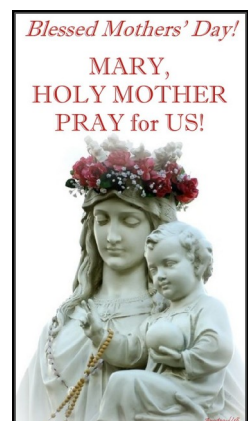
May also reminds us of Our Lady's appearances at Cova da Iria in Fatima, Portugal, to the three shepherd children—Lucia dos Santos, Jacinta, and Francisco Marto—beginning on May 13th. She appeared to them on the 13th of each month until October, except in August, when the children were imprisoned. That month, she appeared to them on August 15th, the Feast of the Assumption. May 25th is the Feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church. Pope Francis established this feast, and it is celebrated every year on the Monday after Pentecost Sunday.

As we honor Mary's motherhood in May, we also celebrate our own mothers. Today is Mother's Day, a joyful occasion for many, created to recognize both birth and adoptive mothers. We also remember those who care for children whose mothers are absent for any reason. Everyone has a mother or a mother figure, and today we honor them all. Many of us have been cared for by more than one mother, through friendship or kindness. To all mothers, thank you for everything you have given us. We celebrate you with prayers, flowers, treats, and, most importantly, with our love and gratitude for your generosity and selflessness.

The writer Mitch Albom reminds us, *"Behind all your stories is always your mother's story, because here is where yours begins."*

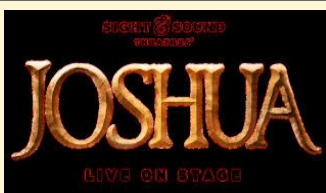

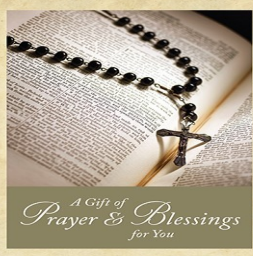

Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament of comfort and hope, not only for those nearing the end of life, but also for the chronically ill and elderly who are in fragile health. Children facing serious illness or major surgery may also receive this sacrament. It can be given more than once, especially if someone recovers and then becomes ill again, or if their condition worsens. If you or a loved one would benefit from anointing, please contact the parish office. **Do not wait until the final moments—family members and caregivers are encouraged to seek this support early, so the Church can offer strength and care when it is most needed.**
